Leave No Trace (PG) 1hr 49mins *Drama*

A father and his 13 year-old daughter are living an ideal existence in the forests of Portland, Oregon, when their idyllic life is shattered and both are forced to re-join society. but how will the father-daughter team cope back in civilisation?

Wednesday 23 January 4.30pm and 7.30pm

The Children Act (12A) 1hr 45mins *Drama*

As her marriage to Jack flounders, eminent High Court judge Fiona Maye (Emma Thompson) has a life-changing decision to make at work - should she force a teenage boy, Adam, to have the blood transfusion that will save his life? Her unorthodox visit to his hospital bedside has a profound impact on them both, stirring strong new emotions in the boy and long-buried feelings in her.

Friday 15 February 7.30pm

Peterloo (12A) 2hrs 34mins *Drama History Biography*

Events surrounding the infamous 1819 Peterloo Massacre when Government forces charged into a crowd of over 60,000 people who had gathered in a peaceful protest against rising poverty and to demand political reform. Many protesters were killed and hundreds more injured, sparking a nationwide outcry.

Wednesday 20 February 4.30pm and 7.30pm

The Wife (15) 1hr 40mins *Drama*

Joan and Joe complement each other after 40 years of marriage. Where Joe is vain, Joan is self-effacing, and where Joe enjoys his public role as the great American novelist, Joan pours her considerable intellect, grace, and diplomacy into the private role of a great man's wife. As Joe is about to be awarded the Nobel Prize for his acclaimed work, Joan starts to think about the shared compromises, secrets and betrayals.

Friday 15 March 7.30pm

The Guardians (Les Gardiennes) (15) 2hrs 18mins *Subtitled Foreign Language Drama*

An affecting human drama of love, loss, and resilience unfolds against the backdrop of World War I. The women of the Paridier farm, under the deft hand of Hortense, the family's matriarch must grapple with the workload while the men, including two sons, are off at the front.

Wednesday 20 March 4.15pm and 7.30pm

A Star Is Born (15) 2hrs 16min *Drama Romance*

Seasoned musician Jackson Maine (Bradley Cooper) discovers and falls in love with struggling artist Ally (Lady Gaga). She has just about given up on her dream to make it big as a singer until Jackson coaxes her into the spotlight. But even as Ally's career takes off, the personal side of their relationship is breaking down, as Jackson fights an ongoing battle with his own internal demons.

Friday 12 April 7.30pm

The Heiresses (Las Herederas) (12A) 1hr 36mins *Subtitled Foreign Language Drama*

Having been together for 30 years, Chela and Chiquita are forced to sell most of their inherited possessions in order to settle rising debts. However, Chiquita is soon sent to prison for fraud, leaving Chela to face up to a challenging new future on her own.

Wednesday 17 April 4.15pm and 7.30pm

First Man (12A) 2hrs 21mins *Drama Biography*

The riveting story behind the first manned mission to the moon, focusing on Neil Armstrong and the decade leading to the historic Apollo 11 flight. A visceral and intimate account told from Armstrong's perspective, the film explores the triumphs and the cost - on Armstrong, his family, his colleagues and the nation itself - of one of the most dangerous missions in history.
